Maritime Usage Licence:

Part 5 (sections 110 to 133) of the Maritime Area Planning Act 2021 (MAPA) provides for the granting of maritime usage licences.

Section 112 of the Act states that the Maritime Area Regulatory Authority (MARA) is the competent authority for the purposes of Part 5 of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) regulations 2011 (S.I No. <u>477 of 2011</u>) and appropriate assessments to which that Part applies.

2.2 Description of proposed Maritime Usage.

Under the auspicious of the Marine Institute funded 'Systematic environmental mapping of Irish wrecks and reefs' (SEMI-WARE), the University College Cork, wishes to deploy the Marine Institute's R.V. Celtic Explorer to conduct systematic, noninvasive seabed monitoring surveys at the Moira Mounds area and additional geophysical and sediment sampling surveys at the localities of three shipwreck sites (namely, SS Miami, HMS Alyssum, and U-58). The data collected as part of the SEMI-WARE survey campaign, will form the basis of the I-PoINt and Moira Mounds Monitoring projects, which are funded by the Marine Institute and Irish Research Council, respectively, and will facilitate additional scientific research to be conducted by students of all levels. The SEMI-WARE project requires a Marine Usage Licence (MUL) from MARA to conduct systematic, non-invasive seabed monitoring surveys at the Moira Mounds where the production of Multibeam echosounder (MBES), Side-Scan-Sonar (SSS), Magnetometer (MAG) and ROV video-photography data seek to build on a considerable body of background research and data focussed, the aim being to shed new insights into their preservation state since being last surveyed by the applicant and his team back in 2020. The geophysical surveys and sediment samples (day grabs) carried out at the localities of the selected shipwreck sites, will provide information on the seafloor geology, broader seafloor conditions and state of shipwrecks sites, with the data produced pertaining to additional insights around the character, preservation state and the potential pollution effect that these shipwrecks have to the adjacent marine environment.

The proposed marine survey activities of SEMI-WARE will take place at some point between April 2025 and May 2025, depending on the R.V. *Celtic Explorer* availability and schedule.

The SEMI-WARE survey activities are estimated to last for 10 days in total, including 1 days of mobilization and 1 day demobilization, out of which 8 days will be spent offshore carrying out the proposed work-scope activities. Details of the proposed survey activities are provided in the Schedule of Work report.

No. The survey vessel in the area will, at times, have restricted manoeuvrability. If a fishing or sailing vessel moves into the vicinity of the survey vessel, contact will be made and a plan for avoidance of that vessel will be made accordingly.

We have engaged with the Marine Institute as the time onboard the R.V. *Celtic Explorer* is funded through their Ship-time Programme.

We have had a pre-application consultation with MARA.

We have also applied for permitting at the National Monuments Service of Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage since part of the proposed work-scope activities involves geophysical surveys and sediment sampling at the localities of three shipwreck sites.

We are also in the process of applying for a licence to conduct marine scientific research in a Deep Water SAC. This licence will be obtained from NPWS via Dr David Lyons.

Part 3: Location and Spatial Extent of Proposed Maritime Area (Attach additional documents as required)

3.1 Location of proposed Maritime Usage





Figure 1: Overview of proposed area of survey of Moira Mounds

The proposed survey activities will be carried out at four different localities, with Figures 1 and 2 providing insights in regard to the areas subject to surveying and pending approval by the competent authority.

For the three shipwreck sites —namely, SS Miami, HMS Alyssum, and U-58— a survey coverage of 100 m x 100 m is to be conducted at each site, surveying the sites in their entirety and their adjacent immediate vicinity, at water depths ranging between 72 m to 81 m(Figure 2), accounting for a total of 10,000 m² at each site and a grand total of 30,000 m² for all selected shipwreck sites.

For the surveys conducted at the Moira Mounds an area of 10 km x 15 km is proposed to be subject to survey coverage at a water depth ranging from 800 m to 1200 m (Figure 1), pertaining to a total survey coverage of $54,540 \text{ m}^2$.




Figure 3 Proposed Licence Areas for Moira Mounds survey






Figure 4 Proposed Licence Areas for shipwreck sites



Part 5: Fishing/Aquaculture Considerations:

5.1 Is the proposal located in proximity to any of the following:

There is no overlap among licensed aquaculture sites or designated Shellfish Growing Waters and the proposed study sites. All sites are inshore, >20 km from the shipwreck sites.

The scope of the survey and its timing (April/May) do not pose any issue with spawning or nursery areas of commercial fish species.

While the License Application Area does overlap spatially with known spawning/nursery grounds for *Nephrops norvegicus*, the survey timing does not coincide with designated spawning season.

5.2 Are there other potential impacts of the proposal on fishing/aquaculture in the area? If yes, please describe.

The main focus of the proposed surveys is to retrieve sediments samples and collect geophysical and ROV video-photography data at the localities of three shipwreck sites; and conduct geophysical and ROV video-photography surveys at the Moira Mounds. For this reason:

- 1. High frequency acoustic and geophysical techniques such as multibeam echosounder (MBES), Acoustic Doppler Current Profile (ADCP), Side-Scan-Sonar (SSS) and Ultra-Short-Baseline (USBL) will be utilised;
- 2. As well as shallow (<0.25 m) sediment samples will be collected via day grabs.

Fish and shellfish species can be sensitive to changes in their environments in terms of noise and sediment plumes. However, given the high-frequency nature of the equipment to be used in this proposed survey it is highly-unlikely to pose a potential impact.

Similarly, the small footprint (< 0.5m) and shallow (< 0.25m) nature of the proposed sampling equipment, coupled with the quick recovery, is highly-unlikely to generate significant sediment plumes.

5.3 Are there any measures proposed to mitigate potential impacts on fisheries or aquaculture? If yes, please describe.

In the absence of clear technical guidelines, none can be suggested. However, the consultation and liaison process with the fishing industry will be important because of its concerns as to potential impacts.


